SHORT-TERM REGO PAYMENTS

We’re reducing the stress of car registration costs for Victorian families, introducing flexible, short-term options for rego payments. New three and six month registration options will allow people to pay less up-front and spread the cost of registration renewal across the year. We will continue to take action where we can to support Victorian families and reduce their cost of living.

METRO



REMOVING THE 50 MOST DANGEROUS LEVEL CROSSINGS

In just two years, the Andrews Labor Government has removed 10 level crossings, opened 12 new train stations and a further 16 level crossing removals are now underway. We’re getting on with the job of removing more dangerous and congested level crossings for good.



24 HOUR PUBLIC TRANSPORT

We’re making all night public transport on weekends a permanent feature of the world’s most liveable city. More than two million trips have been taken on overnight trains, trams, buses and regional coaches since the Labor Government introduced Night Network at the start of last year. More than 20 per cent of the people using Night Network are shift workers, getting home after a night serving drinks, staffing our hospitals or keeping us safe.



The Metro Tunnel is transforming Melbourne, with new stations breathing new life into parts of Melbourne’s CBD. The \$11 billion project will create nearly 7,000 jobs and is one of 80 public projects with strict local content requirements to ensure local workers and businesses get their fair share of the work. Major construction on the tunnel and five new stations is expected to start next year, with the project to be completed by 2026.



JOB

Since coming into government, we’ve created more than 280,000 jobs and our dynamic economy continues to generate real jobs for Victorians. We’ve invested in manufacturing and it is a \$26 billion industry that employs more than 278,000 Victorians across over 13,000 businesses.



NORTHERN HOSPITAL

We’re upgrading the Northern Hospital and will invest \$162.7 million to upgrade the hospital, with an increase in operating theatres and additional beds that will allow an estimated 10,000 more patients to be treated each year. The Stage 2 project will complete a seven storey tower and add 96 new inpatient beds, three operating theatres and more treatment rooms.

JOAN KIRNER HOSPITAL FOR WOMEN & CHILDREN

We’re putting the health of women and children first in Melbourne’s west by building The Joan Kirner Women’s and Children’s Hospital. The hospital will include 20 maternity delivery rooms, 39 special care nursery cots, four operating theatres and additional clinics. Six hundred jobs will be created in Melbourne’s rapidly growing West with construction on the Andrews Labor Government’s new \$200 million hospital now underway.

LOCAL ACHIEVEMENTS



✓ **\$4.57 million** to Upgrade Tullamarine Primary School.

As part of its program to remove asbestos from old school buildings, and replace them with brand new ones.

✓ **\$151,000** to upgrade and modernise Diggers Rest Primary School, including a much-needed refurbishment of classrooms and facilities.



✓ **\$3.9 million** to upgrade and modernise Sunbury Downs College. This includes the refurbishment of classrooms and facilities that are in poor condition.

✓ **\$60,000** For a new the Tullamarine Men's Shed.

Offering an opportunity for men going through a rough time to get the support they need, when they need it.



✓ **\$20 million** to secure and upgrade road surfaces on Melbourne-Lancefield Road.

Between Sunbury and Lancefield, including new overtaking lanes and up to 18 kilometres of flexible road safety barriers and rumble strips to prevent head-on collisions and run-off road crashes.

✓ **10 additional peak hour train services** running to and from Sunbury each week from 27 August 2017.

The Andrews Labor Government has added 10 new Sunbury line train services during peak time every week. It builds on the more than 80 extra services added to Sunbury to get local passengers to work quicker, home sooner and safely.



✓ **\$1.1 million** for a shared path to connect Sunbury to Diggers Rest.

The Andrews Labor Government has made a \$1.1 million promise to better connect Sunbury to Diggers Rest. A 500-metre-long shared path will separate pedestrians and cyclists from high-speed traffic. This project comes from the Government's Growth Areas Infrastructure Contribution program, which funds key projects for Melbourne's growing outer suburbs. Works are expected to begin in early 2018 and be completed later in the year.



✓ **\$4.2 million** Shared Facilities Funding for Sunbury Heights, Sunbury Downs and Hume.

There continues to be an increasing demand for community facilities as the local Sunbury population grows. Thanks to the Andrews Labor Government, a brand-new community hub in Sunbury has been funded.

The new community facility hub forms part of the Andrews Labor Government's plan to encourage community participation and access to local services, as well as provide quality multi-use educational and training facilities as part of the Education State.
